NACM Award for Outstanding Early Career Professional

The NACM Award for Early Career Professional award is presented annually to recognize distinguished service and outstanding contributions to the profession of court administration and the judicial system by an early career professional. The 2017 award will be presented at the NACM Annual Conference in Washington, DC.

CRITERIA

The selection committee will consider all outstanding qualities of nominees in making its' recommendation including exemplified professional proficiency, service to the profession, and service to the community, state, and nation. The individual must also meet the following criteria:

- Be a member in good standing of NACM;
- Meet the Early Career Professional requirements:
 - (1) Less than 10 years of experience in the judicial system; or
 - (2) Under the age of 40;

The ideal recipient is a person whose work reflects a dedication to the ideals embodied in NACM and its purposes. The rules and criteria soliciting nominations for the award shall be circulated to all NACM members.

Nominees will be evaluated by a selection committee of distinguished professionals and colleagues in the field. The committee will select their recommendation for the recipient of the award for the current year.
