BOARD ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Continued the commitment to the National Agenda priorities to drive educational programming
- Implemented the newly adopted Strategic Plan and incorporated the goals, strategies and action items into the working environment of the organization
- Established a foundation segment of the organization to focus on stewardship and fund raising for future initiatives
- Developed marketing strategies focused upon attracting more members, more partnerships and providing alternative means of delivering educational programs
- Established a partnership with NCSC to provide Institute for Court Management (ICM) certification courses at future Midyear Conferences
- Improved collaboration with international associations and began negotiations for a dual partnership with the International Association for Court Administration
- Created an international subcommittee dedicated to developing and promoting partner based programs that strengthen the rule of law and support sister-state/sister-court relationships with the international community
- Promoted the *Model Time Standards for State Trial Courts* endorsed by NACM, the Conference of State Court Administrators, Conference of Chief Justices, and the American Bar Association House of Delegates
- Promoted the High Performance Court Framework as a means to integrate performance improvement in trial courts
- Improved collaboration with COSCA and established the presentation of COSCA white papers at future conferences
- Proceeded with the multiyear revision process of revising the Core Competencies
