 - SHRM Executive Order Impact Zone (EO Impact Zone) They help organizations with this through offering free webinars and providing explanations for impact. <u>Executive Order Impact Zone</u>
 - BEAM Framework: Belonging Enhanced by Access Through Merit (BEAM) <u>SHRM's BEAM Framework for Inclusion: Aligning Merit</u> with Organizational Excellence
