<p>3 minutes 18 seconds</p>	<p>The Trial Court Performance Standards or CourtTools are focused on timeliness, accuracy, and access to justice. Now over the years a number of groups have raised the issue of the justice system's "revolving door." Most recently the <i>National Judicial Task Force to Examine State Courts' Response to Mental Illness</i> alluded to the need to stop the criminal justice system's revolving door with the mentally ill. Given this advocacy, shouldn't we add recidivism as a performance measure to the Trial Court Performance Standards?</p>
<p>6 minutes 11 seconds</p>	<p>Recidivism should not be a Trial Court Performance measure, but it should be collected as system data. Who would be in charge of collecting and managing the system data?</p>
<p>11 minutes 53 seconds</p>	<p>All of you have said that recidivism should not be a Trial Court Performance measure, so I accept that. Setting that aside, do the courts bear some responsibility for the "revolving door" arrest, adjudication, incarceration, release, and re-arrest?</p>
